Assemblies.

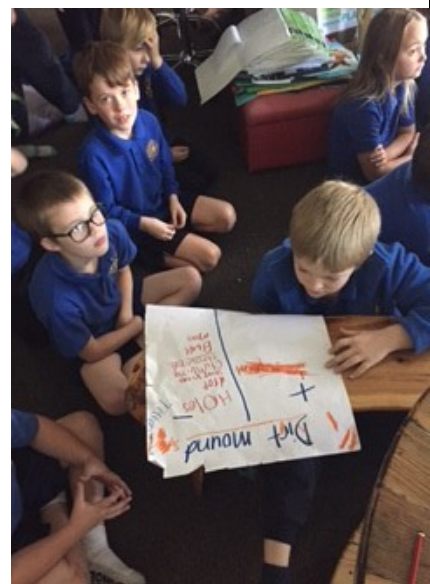
Our assemblies this term will be held on Monday 22nd May at 9am with a presentation from the Year 4s students and on Monday 19th June at 9am with a presentation from the Year 1 and Year 6 students.

Subject Focus.

Year 3 students have been using a variety of reading strategies to read non-fiction texts related to health. They have been identifying the important ideas in a non-fiction text and have discovered that over the last 20 years children have spent less and less time outside. They have considered how germs can make you ill, and have discovered that there is hidden sugar in many foods that claim to be healthy. Students also discussed the need for a balanced lifestyle and how this impacts on the amount of time they should be inside playing video games

The Year 3 students completed a safe play space audit around the school. In groups they audited the safety of many popular play spaces in the school and listed the positives and the negatives about the play space. In their groups they also brainstormed strategies for making the play spaces safer and how their participation in a play space can make it safer. The biggest discovery the students made was around the importance of communicating with each other better when playing in a play space.
